ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Raath Mahavidyalaya, located in Village Paithani in the Thalain block, Pauri Garhwal district, Uttarakhand, was established in 2003 through the dedicated efforts of Shri Ganesh Godiyal Ji, with the support of local citizens and the Gram Sabha. ABOUT THE SEMINAR

In the 21st century, education stands at a transformative crossroads where nations are remaining learning systems to respond to global challenges while preserving their cultural identity. India's vision of Atmanirbhar Bharat places education at the heart of this transformation, emphasizing the need to create learners who are not only knowledgeable but also skilled, self-reliant, innovative and socially responsible. It envisions education as a means for developing not only cognitive abilities but also values, ethics, creativity, critical thinking and practical competencies essential for the new world.

A significant feature of NEP 2020 is the renewed emphasis on Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS), which encompasses India's vast repository of knowledge developed over centuries in areas such as philosophy, science, mathematics, medicine (Ayurveda), agriculture, architecture, arts, governance and ecology. The idea of Atmanirbhar Shiksha extends beyond economic self-sufficiency to include intellectual independence, cultural rootedness and global competitiveness. It seeks to create learners who are not only job seekers but also innovators, entrepreneurs and responsible citizens. Despite NEP 2020's emphasis, IKS integration into mainstream education remains fragmented, marginalizing indigenous knowledge amid inequities, irrelevance and limited skill focus for rural/tribal/disadvantaged learners. An inclusive, skill-based framework requires bridging these gaps by contextualizing learning with local culture, blending vocational/life skills with academics, ensuring equitable access and fusing traditional wisdom with modern science.

Leveraging IKS in education can play a transformative role in achieving these goals by fostering experiential learning, sustainability and community engagement. For instance, traditional crafts can be linked with entrepreneurship, indigenous agricultural practices with environmental education and classical knowledge systems with modern scientific inquiry. Moreover, the emphasis on multidisciplinary education, flexibility in curriculum and competency-based learning under NEP 2020 provides a conducive framework for embedding IKS meaningfully into teaching-learning processes. In this backdrop, the proposed national seminar on "Atmanirbhar Shiksha: Leveraging IKS to Build an Inclusive Skill-Based Framework under NEP 2020" is both timely and significant. A Committee will review the abstracts and full papers and information regarding acceptance, modification, rejection and presentation shall be communicated to the authors subsequently. The selected papers will be published through a reputed national publisher.

Abstract: The abstract should not exceed 300 words. It should clearly state the objective, methodology and summary of results. It should also include title of the abstract, the author's name and designation, institutional affiliation, mailing address, contact number and E-mail Address. The abstract should be typed in English/Hindi (Times New Roman/ Kruti dev 010) font size as 12/16 with 1.5 lining space. Abstract may be sent to mksingh20111@gmail.com latest by 15 October 2026.

Full Paper: The length of full paper including tables, diagrams, illustrations, references, etc. should be in MS Word (doc) between 3000 to 5000 words. The full paper should be typed in English/Hindi font (Times New Roman/ Kruti dev 010) in 12/16 size with 1.5 lining space is acceptable. Bibliographical references should be arranged alphabetically and given at the end of the text in the APA/MLA format. The full version of paper should be submitted in soft copy latest by 25 October, 2026.
